Recently, the WHO declared monkeypox a public health emergency of international concern. An analysis published in NEJM on July 21 noted that 98% of cases were in Men Who Have Sex with Men and 41% were also HIV positive. Atypical presentations are reported and diagnosis within our health systems have been challenging. HIV nurse clinicians and others in public health, sexual health and ER settings may encounter patients who present with suspicious symptoms.
